Roy Igo Found Dead At Home Of Woodrow Horn

Roy Igo, 43, was found dead in bed Friday at the home of a friend, Woodrow Horn, Clearfield Street, West Morehead.

An inquest decided he had been dead about 12 hours when the body was found.

Funeral services were conducted Sunday afternoon at Lane Funeral Home by Rev. Ted Green, followed by burial at Jones Cemetery in Bath County.

He was born in Rowan County July 16, 1928, son of the late Clell Igo; and Ethel (Perry) Igo, who survives. Roy lived at Morehead all his life.

Besides the mother, he leaves a brother, Ray Igo, Putnamville, Ind.; and two sisters – Mrs. Valta Covie of Muncie, Ind., and Mrs. Lorene Carroll, Middletown, O. He was never married.
